

Licensed Providers in Colorado

The Colorado Department of Regulatory Agencies regulates over 50 "Healthcare Professions" and "Occupational Professions and Business Programs." The vast majority are licensing programs; only four of the healthcare professions are registries only (Direct-entry Midwifery, Naturopathic Doctor, Surgical Assistant, Surgical Technology).

Colo. Rev. Stat. § 12-20-102(9) defines a license as "a grant of authority issued by the director or a board or commission pursuant to a part or article of this title 12 that authorizes a person to engage in a profession or occupation regulated by that part or article."
